About Taraweeh

Taraweeh is special prayer after Isha prayer during Ramadan that you pray in sets of two. You should try to do four sets, a total of eight rakats! The prayer occurs right after Isha. The two rakats are longer than the usual because during taraweeh you finish reading the whole Quran.

Narrated Abu Salama bin `Abdur Rahman:

that he asked `Aisha "How was the prayer of Allah's Messenger (ﷺ) in Ramadan?" She replied, "He did not pray more than eleven rak`at in Ramadan or in any other month. He used to pray four rak`at ---- let alone their beauty and length----and then he would pray four ----let alone their beauty and length ---- and then he would pray three rak`at (witr)." She added, "I asked, 'O Allah's Messenger (ﷺ)! Do you sleep before praying the witr?' He replied, 'O `Aisha! My eyes sleep but my heart does not sleep."



Sighting Ramadan

In the Islamic calendar, a new month begins with the sighting of a new moon. Ramadan is the month after Sha'ban. When there's a new crescent moon, it is the beginning of Ramadan. Maghrib marks the beginning of a new day.

Muslims fast in Ramadan because it makes us come closer to Allah. Fasting is one of the five pillars of Islam. We fast by not eating or drinking until iftar. Before fajr prayer, we eat suhoor. We fast from Fajr to Maghrib. Iftar is immediately after Maghrib athan. It is recommended to break your fast with dates and water, if you don't have dates, you can break your fast with water. The Prophet (saw) used to break his fast with dates and water.



Fasting the month of Ramadan is one of the five pillars of Islam. Fasting is the fourth pillar of Islam or Sawm.


What Is Ramadan?


Six facts about Ramadan to memorize

1. One of the last 10 days of Ramadan, there is a Night called Laylat- Al- Qadr, The Night Of Power. This night is better than 1,000 months!
2. The Quran was revealed in the Night of Power (Laylatul Qadr).
3. Fasting is the fourth pillar of Islam.
4. Ramadan is the ninth month of the lunar year.
5. There's either 29 or 30 days in Ramadan and any lunar month.
6. Prophet Muhammad, peace and blessings of Allah be upon him, taught us, "Whoever fasts the fast of Ramadan believing and expecting its recompense from Allah, and passes this month with ibadah his/her past sins are forgiven."
