For suhur, there is no specific du'a to be said at this time. What is prescribed is to say "Bismillah" at the beginning and to praise Him when one stops eating, as should be done at every meal.

But the one who delays his sahur until the last third of the night also catches up with the time of the divine descent, and this is a time when duas are answered!

Abu Hurayrah (may Allah be pleased with him) narrated that the Messenger of Allah (peace and blessings of Allah be upon him) said: "Our Lord, may He be Blessed and Exalted, comes down to the lowest heaven every night when the last third of the night is left. He says: 'Who will call upon Me, that I may answer him? Who will ask of Me, that I may give him? Who will ask Me for forgiveness, that I may forgive him?'"

Narrated by al-Bukhari (1094) and Muslim (758). So he should say du'a at this time because it is a time when du'a is answered.

What Is Taraweeh?

Taraweeh is a prayer prayed after Isha. Taraweeh is prayed in sets of two. According to hadith from Sahih Al Bukhari, The Prophet (SAW) would pray eight rakats of taraweeh. Whoever prays taraweeh hoping for reward, then his/her previous sins will be forgiven. You should pray taraweeh at the masjid as you will get a greater reward.

Abu Salamah reported: He asked Aisha, may Allah be pleased with her, "How was the night prayer of the Messenger of Allah, peace and blessings be upon him, in Ramadan?" Aisha said, "He would not pray more than eleven cycles in Ramadan or other times. He would pray four cycles, but do not ask about their beauty or length. Then, he would pray four cycles, but do not ask about their beauty or length. Then, he would pray three cycles. I asked: O Messenger of Allah, do you sleep before witr prayer? The Prophet said: **O Aisha, my eyes sleep but my heart does not sleep.**"







Blessings of Suhoor


There is a great deal of blessing in suhoor which includes benefits both in this world and in the Hereafter. These blessings include the following:

1. It gives strength for worship and helps one to obey Allaah during the day by praying, reading Qur'aan and remembering Allaah (dhikr). One who is hungry may become lazy in worship just as he may become lazy in his daily work, this is something that is well known.
2. Suhoor wards off the bad attitude that may be provoked by hunger, so the one who eats suhoor will be in a good mood and will interact well with others.
3. The one who eats suhoor will be encouraged to fast more, because fasting is less difficult for the one who eats suhoor, so he will be encouraged to fast and it will not be so difficult for him.
4. Eating suhoor is following the Sunnah, so if the person who eats suhoor has the intention of obeying the command of the Prophet (peace and blessings of Allaah be upon him) and following his example, then his suhoor is an act of worship, so he will be rewarded for it accordingly. If he intends thereby to gain physical strength for fasting and praying qiyaam, he will be rewarded according to that.
5. The person who eats suhoor gets up at the end of the night to remember Allaah, make du'aa' and pray, for that is when prayers are answered and it is the time when Allaah and angels send blessings upon those who eat suhoor, because of the hadeeth of Abu Sa'eed (may Allaah be pleased with him) which will be quoted below.
6. By eating suhoor one differs from the people of the Book. The Muslim is required to avoid imitating them. The Prophet (peace and blessings of Allaah be upon him) said: "The difference between our fasting and the fasting of the people of the Book is eating suhoor."
7. Another blessing of suhoor is praying Fajr in congregation, at the proper time. Hence you see that there are more worshippers praying Fajr in Ramadaan than in other months, because they have gotten up for suhoor.


The fasting person should be keen to eat suhoor and he should not miss it because he feels too sleepy or for any other reason. He should be easy going when he is woken for suhoor and in a good mood, happy to be following the command of the Messenger of Allaah (peace and blessings of Allaah be upon him) and keen to attain its goodness and barakah (blessing), because our Prophet (peace and blessings of Allaah be upon him) affirmed the importance of suhoor and enjoined it, and explained that it is the symbol of the Muslims' fasting that differentiates their fasting from that of the people of the Book, and he told us not to omit suhoor.


Suhoor may be done by means of the least amount of food or drink that a person consumes, it does not have to be any specific kind of food.

The Messenger of Allah said: “Whoever provides Iftar for a fasting person in Ramadan, than that shall be a forgiveness for his minor sins and freedom from the fire. For such a feeder, shall be the same reward as the one who fasted without that person’s reward being decreased in the least.”









The 9th month in the Islamic Calender that is observed by Muslims worldwide




Ramadan marks a month of fasting from sunrise to sunset

The Story of the King and the Boy

Lesson from the Sunnah

Part One

Prophet Muhammad (Sallallahu 'Alayhi wa Sallam) said:

Among the people who came before you, there was a king who had a sorcerer, and when that sorcerer became old, he said to the king,

"I have become old and my time is nearly over, so please send me a boy whom I can teach magic."

So, he sent him a boy and the sorcerer taught him magic. Whenever the boy went to the sorcerer, he sat with a monk who was on the way and listened to his speech and admired them. So, when he went to the sorcerer, he passed by the monk and sat there with him; and on visiting the sorcerer the latter would thrash him. So, the boy complained about this to the monk.

The monk said to him, "Whenever you are afraid of the sorcerer, say to him: 'My people kept me busy.' And whenever you are afraid of your people, say to them: 'The sorcerer kept me busy.'"

So the boy carried on like that (for some time). Then a huge terrible creature appeared on the road and the people were unable to pass by.

The boy said, "Today I shall know whether the sorcerer is better or the monk is better." So, he took a stone and said,

"O Allah! If the deeds and actions of the monk are liked by You better than those of the sorcerer, then kill this creature so that the people can cross (the road)."

Then he struck it with a stone killing it and the people passed by on the road.

The Prophet (ﷺ) said,

"If somebody eats or drinks forgetfully then he should complete his fast, for what he has eaten or drunk, has been given to him by Allah."
